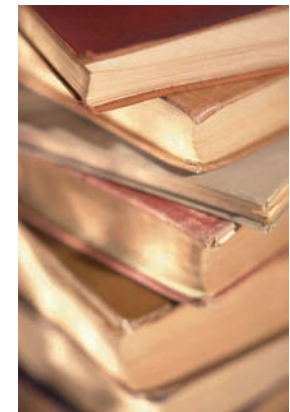

TUSD's Education Professions Program



Seeing students develop new skills and gain an appreciation of knowledge and learning can be very rewarding.

The Education Professions program is designed to prepare students for employment or post secondary opportunities in the education field. The program provides instruction in education career choices, education structure and systems, theory, developmental stages, learning styles and methodology. The program also provides interactive experiences with students at different age levels, in a variety of content areas in educational environments. Education Professions is designed to articulate with the Introduction to Education courses at Pima Community College and para professional preparation programs.

Education Professions' Student Organization

Future Educators of America (FEA) is a national program for middle and high school students interested in exploring careers in education. It helps students gain a realistic understanding of the nature of education and the role of the teacher.

TUSD chapters may:

- invite a panel of speakers to an upcoming FEA chapter meeting
- establish a teacher shadowing program
- establish a mentoring and/or an Adopt a Future Teacher program
- invite the state and/or a TUSD Teacher of the Year to speak
- provide a series of workshops on various teaching topics at FEA meetings during the school year
- develop and carry out a service project to benefit the local school or community
- establish a teacher recognition and appreciation program at the chapter's school
- attend national or state FEA conferences

Career Opportunities in Education Professions

Job opportunities for educators over the next 10 years will vary from good to excellent, depending on the locality, grade level, and subject taught. Most job openings will be attributable to the expected retirement of a large number of teachers. More career opportunities exist with increased experience and education.
